# Dog Training Tips - Dealing with puppy biting!





Puppy biting is a normal and essential part of their development. Puppies use their mouths to explore the world around

them and their teeth to learn bite inhibition. Bite inhibition is the term used when a puppy is learning how much pressure they can apply to living and non-living things. Puppy biting or play biting can become a problem if it is encouraged and reinforced by family members and the puppy is not taught an alternative. Puppy biting can then lead to resentment and dislike of the puppy so it is important to address it

where you feel it has escalated into a problem.

#### So what to do:

Request that all members of the family & friends, do not encourage your puppy to bite.

Avoid playing rough and tumble with your puppy/dog, or letting him pull on clothing, hands or hair. He will then think its ok to do these things and it isn't fair to change the rules and be inconsistent.

Always give the puppy an alternative to bite / grab such as a ragga toy, in some cases you may have to carry a toy around with you when they have a tendency to hold on to your clothing and rag it.

Consider if your dog is hungry, tired or needs the toilet as these can trigger the behaviour.

Try to spot the signs and act before it gets out of control..


NEVER smack your puppy on the nose for puppy biting. If your puppy starts to become fearful of your hands and see them as a threat they may become snappy in an attempt to keep them away.

This will have a knock on effect to other areas of their lives such a recall when off lead. Good luck!




# GSPCA Purple Week February 11th—17th— Celebrating 140 years of Caring for Animals in Guernsey.



GSPCA is urging all pet owners to ensure you animals microchip details are up to date. In this modern world with mobile phones we often change numbers and occasionally move address but without these details being kept up to date can mean your pet isn't reunited as quickly as it could be.

To update your pets microchip details please refer to the registration paper work you should have received though the post after having your animal chipped or sent change of owner details if adopted or taken on from a previous

If you can not find these details the GSPCA can help. All you need do is pop your cat or dog along to the Shelter and we can scan it for you and let you know who you need to contact. ?

The GSPCA microchip dogs and cats for only £4.99p. No appointment necessary just pop your animal up to the Shelter Monday to Saturday 9am to 4.30pm.

### 'Refined mineral oils' blamed for bird contamination

Hundreds of sea birds were affected by what was thought to be refined mineral oils.

From Cornwall to Sussex much of the English South Coast has been affected and many organisations have been involved from the Environment Agency to the RSPCA in the UK.


With a wide variety of sea birds wintering along the English Channel and many Guillemots already found deceased or heavily contaminated if you see any birds affected in the Bailiwick please do let us know at the

If you find you kind a bird affected then here is a little advice -

- •Do not risk your safety by looking for or picking up birds from dangerous locations. Be aware of the tides and weather conditions.
- •If you do find an oiled bird and it is safe to pick it up, ensure that you are wearing gloves because the oil could be hazardous to your health. The birds may also try to peck you, so keep them away from your face.
- ·Collected birds should be placed on

their own in cardboard boxes with newspaper or a towel.





Call the GSPCA 24 hour help line on 01481 257261 Please do not attempt to wash or feed the bird yourself leave that to the Shelter staff and volunteers who have the correct training and facilities.

The GSPCA have a new range of reflective coats, leads and collars on sale for dogs and reflective safety collars for cats.

Even before the coats went on sale 14 were sold to staff and volunteers at the GSPCA for

their dogs and they are leading the way in safety when walking their dogs at night or early morning.



### **Abandoned Guinea Pigs**



Seven guinea pigs were found abandoned outside St Martins Church. In November. All quite young the 7 guinea pigs were found in a dirty blue box out in the rain. Sadly this was the second group of guinea pigs that had been found abandoned in Guernsey

over the space of a month. Thankfully both groups were found and brought into the Shelter where they could be cared for. As many of you will know Guinea pigs are prolific breeders and after a check by the Vet we found, as expected, that the females were pregnant which meant even more homes would have to be found!

The GSPCA would urge anyone that needs to rehome their pets not to dump them as it puts them at risk of death or injury and if found the person responsible could be prosecuted.

"Please consider rehoming a rescue animal before buying one at a pet shop or from a private breeder"

No1: Hunger and Thirst - we must provide food and water to ensure our pets thrive...




No2: Pain and Injury - we must takeour pets to the vets if they are unwell

to express natural behaviours.







The following rises will take affect from the 1st March 2013:

Boarding dogs from £15 to £15.75 pd

Boarding cats from £9.25 to £9.75 pd

Cremation charges—variable

Dog training classes from £40 to £50 for a course of 6 lessons.
